STRATEGIC PLAN DEVELOPMENT

In the summer of 2023, Quincy Catholic Schools, with a grant from the Tracy Family Foundation, hired Partners In Mission to guide and facilitate strategic planning with the goal to establish a plan that would guide the organization's efforts for the next 3-5 years.

Seven strategic planning committees were formed in the fall of 2023 - Catholic identity, academics, advancement, enrollment and marketing, facilities, finance, and student life. These committees were tasked with writing a narrative to provide a current assessment of each domain. In order to complete this task, the teams reviewed community survey results (nearly 500 responses) and collaborated with school leadership and staff to collect data. By February 2024, each of the seven domains had drafted narratives based on their findings. In April, a two-day retreat with more than 70 participants was held. During this retreat, participants reviewed the domain narratives and drafted a vision statement and objectives for each domain marking the first collaborative effort across the four parishes and schools. The visions and objectives listed below were ratified by the Provisional Advisory Board and Provisional Corporate Board in May 2024. Tactics and goals are currently being created by the Provisional Advisory Board to guide the efforts to meet these objectives.

CATHOLIC IDENTITY

Quincy Catholic Schools will be a Christ-centered community flowing from our parishes that supports families in living out their vocations to know, love, and serve God.

Objectives:

- Promote parish and school stewardship through evangelizing encounters with Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass.
- Collaborate with the Catholic community of parishes to engage youth in faith formation in and outside of the school day.
- Develop and implement a framework for consistent clergy presence in both sacramental and non-sacramental interactions.
- Develop and implement a shared curricular plan that abides by diocesan standards for general PreK-8th grade religious instruction.



ACADEMICS

Quincy Catholic Schools will form Catholic disciples of Christ through a spiritually guided, academically rigorous, differentiated, and comprehensive curriculum.

Objectives:

- Prioritize recruiting, hiring, developing, and retaining high-quality teachers, staff, and administrators.
- Collaborate regularly to provide comparable academic opportunities for all students.
- Integrate Catholic teachings and experiences across all curricular areas.
- Create, implement, and sustain an instructional system with qualified staff and resources to promote learning for all students, as children of God.

ADVANCEMENT

Quincy Catholic Schools will be empowered by stewardship and solidarity to solicit and secure resources to ensure long-term sustainability.

Objectives:

- Create a culture of giving through a community-wide education and communication plan that articulates the unique value of Quincy Catholic Schools.
- Establish and execute a unified plan for fundraising and communication that clearly defines the needs and values of Quincy Catholic Schools.
- Address misperceptions and provide transparency on how parish funds are allocated to support our school system.
- Develop strategies to secure financial stability and growth through diversified, long-term philanthropic revenue streams.



ENROLLMENT

Quincy Catholic Schools will attract, enroll, and retain families by promoting the value of an authentic Catholic education.

Objectives:

- Create intentional enrollment guidelines that promote our Catholic mission, identity, and faith.
- Collectively maximize enrollment to fully utilize all available faculty, staff, facilities, and financial resources to provide quality Catholic education to our families.
- Ensure that every family that desires a Catholic education can enroll by keeping tuition affordable.
- Develop a cohesive strategy to retain current families from PreK through 8th grade.
- Promote enrollment through the development of a data-driven, system-wide marketing strategy focused on the proven benefits of Catholic education.

FACILITIES

Quincy Catholic Schools will commit to and invest in well-maintained, safe, secure, and accessible facilities.

Objectives:

- Establish and implement a maintainable master facilities plan to
 - guide resource allocations
 - balance facilities utilization
 - coordinate maintenance
 - identify and address future needs



FINANCE

Quincy Catholic Schools will commit to business operations, accounting framework, and fiscal processes to advance the viability and vitality of our mission.

Objectives:


- Attract, retain, and support a team devoted to our Christ-centered community by providing competitive compensation and employee benefits both tangible and intangible.
